

Press Release September 29, 2016 (Nashua Telegraph & Milford Cabinet)

On September 16, 2016 Milford Town Officials participated in a state-wide conference call hosted by state officials to discuss the continued drought conditions across the state. Southern New Hampshire, including the Town of Milford, is experiencing extreme drought conditions. During the call, the State of New Hampshire recommended increased water conservation measures that have been posted on the Town Website.

The Town of Milford Board of Selectmen and Water Utilities Commissioners encourage all residents, businesses and industries to monitor water consumption and implement water conservation measures. Effective immediately, the town is asking all residents, businesses, industries and government facilities served by private wells or the municipal water system to stop using water for any outdoor purposes, with the exception of vegetable gardens and newly planted vegetation. All town owned properties and facilities will abide by this restriction.

Residents are also alerted that continued drought conditions may create supply shortage concerns extending throughout the winter, especially for users of private wells. Even though this restriction is voluntary and temporary, all residents, businesses and industries are strongly encouraged to establish water conservation efforts to assist the community in meeting our water needs through the winter.
