Appointment: Minimum Expedited Wetland Impact permit application for a driveway crossing on M3L10. Jason Bolduc of Meridian Land Services presented a plan for Andrew Gardent, who wants to construct a driveway on an existing woods road which crosses a wetland. There will be approximately 1500 sq.ft of buffer impact in grading the existing woods road; an additional 300+ sq.ft of wetland impact. He will install a 30' HDPE culvert which will be embedded 6" below grade to present a natural bottom for animal passage. The NHB (Natural Heritage Bureau) report included in the Wetland Permit Application indicates a sighting of a Spotted Turtle in 2016.

Mr. Gardent intends to do the work when the ground is either frozen or dry. Currently there is a timber harvest underway to create pasture and fields. Pictures included in the application show that there has been some vehicular activity in this wetland crossing. The landowner has been advised that this activity should stop until the crossing is protected; at the very minimum using Best Management Practices from Good Forestry in the Granite State. This impact meets the criteria for a minimum impact project. Andy signed the permit application, enabling it to be expedited through the review process at NH DES.
