<p>5. Reports</p>	<p>Milford Community Land Ecological Inventory and Impact Assessment – stream channel gauges have been installed on either side of the Heron Pond Rd culvert and one at the beaver dam.</p>	
	<p>Town Forests:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mile Slip TF – Several MCC members met with Eric Radlof, Forester, and members of the Ruffed Grouse Society on June 3 at MSTF. They walked the site of the proposed Early Successional Habitat Restoration project, Stand 3. The Ruffed Grouse members will work with the MCC with invasives management to support the work to include Ruffed Grouse in our management decisions. Is it sensible to use a forestry practice in the relatively cleared 2 acres around the parking area that will have less impact on the surface? 	
	<p>Wetland Overlay District update – Rich emailed some links to resources to help guide our work.</p>	
	<p>Armory Rd /Rail Trail crossing. The members decided to drop our application for the 2024 RTP grant. The timing of the grant won't help our efforts to make the improvements before the 2023 Ghost Train races in October. There have been significant delays in the NHFG review of our project which threaten our timely submission of the application by June 16. The Granite Town Rail Trail Revolving Fund should have enough money to complete the project.</p>	
	<p>Open subdivisions – place holders to check for changes Falcon Ridge – Monumentation of lots. Spaulding – Monumentation and easement of the open space No changes in status for either since last mtg</p>

<p>7. Interdepartmental Review.</p>	<p>a) Map 43-20-2 Gas station on South Street. Request for a Variance for a gas station in a Well Head Protection Area and a Special Exception for fill of a buffer and wetland. Matt Peterson, Keach Nordstrom, presented the results of his research to address the concerns raised by the MCC after their site visit. He asserts that there are only 2 private wells located in the wellhead protection area indicated on the map. The applicant is using state of the art technology with fiberglass tanks and flexible piping. The applicant removed one of the diesel pumps from the proposed plan. He</p>	<p>a. 	<p>rejects the idea that wildlife may be using this location due to the functional assessment of a low value wetland and that the parcel is within a potential wildlife corridor as indicated in the NHFG Wildlife Corridor Map. The members discussed his presentation and decided that there was nothing new presented to compel a change of opinion. The memo to the ZBA will be updated to reflect the latest presentation and that the MCC does not consider that this is a good use in the Wellhead Protection Area 1, as prohibited by the Zoning Ordinance.</p> <p>b) Hitchiner Special Exception M7L20 – Request for a Special Exception for an impact in the wetland buffer. Earl Blanchford, Hayner/Swanson, presented the proposed project to widen the driveway at 96 Old Wilton Rd to accommodate a change of use from commercial condos to a manufacturing facility. Hitchiner Manufacturing purchased the lot (ML 007-020) to move an outsourced manufacturing process to Milford. This will require a >4000 sqft wetland buffer impact. Several of the MCC members attended a site visit with the applicant on June 6, 2023 along with Planning Board and Zoning Board members. Rich drafted a ZBA memo based on the discussion at the site visit, which was edited and accepted at the June 8 meeting. The MCC did not have any objections to the proposed wetland buffer impacts.</p>
