Brief History – Keyes Park

1952 - Henry Laxon inherited the property from the heirs of original owner Josiah Crosby

1957 - Arthur L. Keyes Memorial Trust purchases & donates the land to the Milford School District (need = playing fields)

1964 – Orchestrated land exchange between Milford Town Government and Milford School District – Endicott Park for Keyes Park (need = swimming pool)

Starting with playing fields, Keyes Park has grown over the years in response to our community's recreation needs and with the help of many volunteers and community organizations.

Recent History – Closure??

The Threat of Multi-year Closure ~ 2011 – 2015

- 2-3 year closure of Keyes Park during EPA clean-up of Fletcher site
- Closure of Keyes Drive for public access
- Loss of access easement over 127 Elm property



Recent History - The Solution

The Solution

- Purchase 127 Elm Street
 - Provides access for immediate need
 - Provides long-term secondary access
 - Provides additional space for parking
 - Provides additional space for recreational activities and facilities
- The Cost (original figures)
 - \$190,000 Cash payment ALL donations
 - \$ 88,000 Property tax forgiveness
 - \$220,800 Value/Tax write-off by owners

Now what? How to integrate....

What we got-

- A second/west entrance to Keyes
- 5.8 acres of relatively flat land
- Additional parking space
- 33,000± SF building space





Keyes Memorial Park Expansion Committee

- The Board of Selectman appointed a committee and charged it with developing short and long term recommendations for the integration of 127 Elm into Keyes Memorial Park.
- The group consisted of 13 Milford citizens and employees with various knowledge of the parks, recreation, facilities and community planning.
- The committee has been meeting bi-monthly since April to research, analyze and formulate a set of recommendations.

The Charge



- Include Keyes Park as a whole (master plan)
- Community recreational priorities that could be located on the property - Additional playing fields and parking?
- Other Town space needs that could be accommodated
- Building evaluation current conditions & potential uses including potential ongoing costs
 - Rent portions of building to generate income?
 - Opportunity for short term lease of existing building while planning activities are underway?

Methodology

- Reviewed current status of the Keyes Park facilities
- Obtained professional evaluation of the 127 Elm Street building(s)
- Sought input from other Municipal Departments and the School District
- Sought public input on our community's recreational interests and needs, and current use of Keyes Park

Incorporate the priorities included in the Milford Master Plan and (pending) Recreation Chapter



DPW in Action!

- Cleared significant sections of scrub & trees
- Created additional parking
- Added striping etc.
- Cleaned-up perimeter
- Cleaned-out building
- Property secured







Findings @ 127 Elm St

- Structural steel/"Bare bones skeleton" fine
- Roof all needs replacement
- Floors combination of replacement, fill and other work
- HVAC, Electrical & Plumbing all need replacement
- Fire suppression system enters complex through the west building

Findings @ 127 Elm St

Professional Estimates

Renovation of the existing 30,000 SF building – primary space in middle and east buildings; west section for storage	\$2,856,306
Demolition of the existing building and construction of a new 30,000 SF building with an unfinished second floor	\$3,797,502

Note: The fire suppression system for the three structures enters from the west building. Any changes of that entrance point would require a complete re-design of the system with additional costs.

Keyes Park Master Plan – Phase 1

Phase 1 - 6 months to 1 year

- 1. ADA compliant walking /biking path around Keyes Park
- 2. Move ball field & create multi-purpose field
- 3. Revise parking & add lighting on east side of park
- 4. Lighting on west side of park
- 5. Signage
- 6. Interconnected road between east and west side of the park
- 7. Install (10) exercise stations along the river side of walking/biking path
- 8. Create shaded areas with seating
- 9. Development of a town wide parks and recreation maintenance plan including fields

Keyes Park Master Plan – Phase 2

<u>Phase 2</u> – 5 years


- 1. Smaller new building with space to accommodate future expansion
- 2. Hockey/basketball courts
- 3. Remove pump house
- 4. Remove current basketball and create picnic area
- 5. Multipurpose field and parking
- 6. Remove existing 127 Elm building

Keyes Park Master Plan – Phase 3

<u>Phase 3</u> – 8-10 years

- 1. Complete landscaping
- 2. Final lighting
- 3. Complete walkways through park
- 4. Bridge to North River Road fields




Keyes Park Master Plan – East Entrance

Overall Recommendations (1)

- Integrate the two parcels in word & deed as Keyes Memorial Park
- Secure the three buildings to prevent further vandalism or deterioration – Remodel/prepare for renting?? Major concerns about return on investment (costs, liability, loss of parking etc.) and about undermining the stated reasons for purchasing the property - Recreation
- In the next 12 months, the BOS, Recreation Department & Commission, and DPW collaborate to develop a prioritized plan to repair and maintain the facilities at Keyes Park some of this work is already underway at DPW

Overall Recommendations (2)

Move forward with the "low hanging fruit"

- Build a gravel connector road on the south side to connect the east and west parking areas – improve access management
- Expand the east parking area and add lighting as identified on the Fieldstone plan and add lighting in the west parking lot
- Build a walk-bike path around the perimeter of Keyes Park
- Beautify the fields by adding some shaded areas and landscaping
- Reactivation of the yellow blinking light on Elm St at the west entrance for use during high volume events – promote traffic and pedestrian safety
- Complete design requirements for the east entrance to Keyes Memorial Park (aka the Fletcher site)

Overall Recommendations (3)

- Centralize Milford's recreation programming and department at Keyes Park – build a Community Recreation Center - frees up space at Town Hall and parking around the Oval & increases accessibility to programs
- BOS collaborates with the Recreation Department & Commission to appoint a committee to develop a strategic plan to design and fund a Community Recreation Center at Keyes Memorial Park
- BOS asks the voters in March 2017 to establish a capital reserve fund for the design, development, and construction of improvements to Keyes Memorial Park starting
- Longer term goal feasibility study of building a pedestrian connection between Keyes Memorial Park and the North River Road recreational fields.
