Recycling at Milford Middle School

- Milford Middle School achieved the Gold Level (highest level of recognition) for School Recycling with the Northeast Resource Recovery Association. This entitles the school to receive a tree to plant and to send two students to the NRRA Recycling Conference this spring.
- The MMS Green Club will participate in the Sustainability Fair at Wilton Lyndeborough High School on April 14. They will be showing videos on the environment and selling their stainless 'Think outside the Bottle' stainless water bottles.
- An MMS Student that has been selected to display her artwork in a Save our Oceans art exhibit sponsored by NH Plastic Pollution Alliance and Art & Dialogue. It will be on exhibit at the Keene Library for the month of April.
- MMS Green Club created a short recycling video and submitted it to the Pepsi Rally as a potential fundraiser. Celeste will send to Town of Milford webmaster to ask if the video can play on the Cable access channel.
- MMS hopes to schedule another Green Week this spring. They are waiting to find out when standardized testing will occur before they can schedule the special events.

Recycling Presentation

Celeste shared that she and Diane, along with some other teachers and friends initiated a Boomerang Bag Community project in Milford. They held a pilot Boomerang Bag Sewing Bee on Feb. 3rd at the Wadleigh Library. The public was invited to drop in for a demonstration on the making of reusable shopping bags from t-shirts. Educational videos on "The Life of a Plastic Bag" and "Plastic Ocean" were played. People shared ideas on recycling plastic bags and fabrics and other places and events where reusable Boomerang bags could be distributed. The first shop in Milford is using boomerang bags and another two phoned today to request them.

Boomerang Bags work to reduce the use of plastic bags by engaging local communities in the making of Boomerang Bags using recycled materials. Boomerang Bags provide a free, fun, sustainable alternative to plastic bags.

Visitors also took a pledge to reuse bags when shopping and to stop using single use plastic bags. The next drop in sewing bee will be at Free Spirit Boutique on the Milford Oval Sat March 10th from 1-4 pm
