<u>Job Description</u>: Based at the ambulance facility, responds to emergency and non-emergency pre-hospital ambulance calls. Renders basic and advanced patient care per state and local protocols as needed. Performs daily tasks including but not limited to emergency vehicle operation, maintenance, and cleaning. Performs daily clerical tasks such as phone answering, cleaning and maintaining of facility. Maintains logs and fills out patient care records for all calls handled. Trains Milford Ambulance Staff and others as directed in pre-hospital ambulance and emergency medical procedures. Performs public relations as directed.

Accountability: Works independently and under the direction of the Ambulance Director.

Equipment Used: Ambulance, approved Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Life Support (ALS) equipment, computer and software, printer, photocopier, and telephone.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Except as specifically noted, the following functions are considered essential to this position.

Works independently and under the direction of the Ambulance Director on either twelve or twenty-four hour shifts as needed. Assures safe, timely response and transportation of sick or injured patients in Milford's ambulances. Checks, stocks, cleans and prepares ambulances and facility each day. Works with Milford Ambulance volunteers. Performs public relations as directed.
