Hazardous Waste

Household Hazardous waste in the trash. on the ground, down the sink, or into a storm drain poses a threat to water quality and may kill fish and wildlife and injure humans and animals.

Nashua Regional Planning Commission sponsors hazardous waste collections 5 times per year. They will collect:

WHAT NOT TO BRING

Latex Paint	Less than 1/4 full containers can be dried out in the can. For larger quantities: use a sturdy cardboard box lined with a plastic trash bag Absorbent material like kitty litter or sawdust can be added. Let air dry. When crispy dry, dispose of at transfer station
Smoke Detectors or Fire Extinguishers	Return to manufacturer
Explosives, Fireworks, Ammunition	Call local fire department or police for proper disposal
Used Oil or Auto Batteries	Landfill/transfer station, auto parts stores
Propane Tanks	Take to landfill/transfer station
Asbestos	Contact private contractor
Creosote	Contact private contractor

For your information:

Milford NH has a mandatory recycling program that reduces our taxes for waste disposal and helps the environment.

- Dump permits may be obtained at transfer station office.
- Household trash not specifically listed as recyclable will be transferred to an incinerator for disposal.
- Leaves and grass clippings should be brought to our composting area, located on the hill. Empty out all bags!
- Bring your own reusable bags shopping to reduce the waste of single use bags.
- Consider backyard composting to reduce the waste you transport to the Transfer Station.

RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

Paper, Cardboard, Metal, Composting

Recycle Mixed Paper: Magazines, newspapers and inserts, phone books, junk mail, paper tubes, non-corrugated, printed cardboard; envelopes, clean food cartons.

NO foil, carbon or plastic coated paper, tissues or napkins.

Corrugated Cardboard and Brown paper bags: Dry and flattened. No wax-coated or otherwise lined boxes accepted.

Mixed Metals: Cast iron, aluminum, copper, brass or other metals are recycled. Please remove doors on refrigerators and plastic racks from dishwashers.

Compost: Recycle leaves and grass clippings and take FREE finished compost.

Woody Brush less than 5" diameter is accepted and converted to wood chips. Wood chips are Free!



RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

Clean Glass Bottles: Emptied & rinsed, with lids and caps removed! Also accepted: Ceramics & porcelain bathroom fixtures w/metal fixtures removed, Broken or opaque glass, Pyrex, mirrors, and crystal.

Plastic Bottles: with the following recycling symbols on the bottom:





NOTE: #3 thru 7 plastics are NOT recyclable in our program
No plastic toys. No yogurt, cottage cheese, pudding, or foam containers.

Metal Cans

Aluminum and Steel/Tin cans emptied and rinsed, labels removed. NO aerosol cans NO aluminum foil and food trays
